NITS IN SCHOOL

Advice from the NHS and Department for Education is to manage head lice in school-age children, you should **check your child's hair weekly** using a fine-toothed comb, **notify the school** if you find lice so they can ask other parents to check, and **treat anyone with lice** in your household on the same day. Children **do not need to stay home from school** if treated, but you should avoid head-to-head contact until the lice are gone.
